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### **SHIPS HISTORY**

The Sound Fisher was acquired by John Fisher & Co Ltd, Barrow in 1915, and then sold to John Slater Limited, Barrow in 1919. In 1920 the Sound Fisher was sold to John Kelly Limited, Belfast and renamed the 'Causeway'. The 'Causeway' was then sold on to St. Helen's Colliery & Brick Works, Workington in 1932.

The 'Causeway' arrived in Glasgow on 11 May 1933 at Lithgows yard for breaking up.

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
